Federal Record Centers (NARA) - **Mr. David Weinberg** has been the Director of the Federal Record Center Program of the National Archives and Records Administration since 1999. Prior to this appointment, Mr. Weinberg was the Deputy Commissioner for the Department of Records for the city of Philadelphia and served as project director of the Philadelphia Electronic Records Project.

Mr. Weinberg will conduct a presentation of records and information management services available through the existing Inter-Government Agreement (IGA) already in place and used by most federal agencies using FRC resources.

Federal Prison Industries (UNICOR) - **Mr. Frederick H. Roach** has 26 years of federal service experience and is currently the Account Executive for UNICOR. As such, he is responsible for nationwide service coordination of multiple business/service lines available to the federal agencies.

Mr. Roach will be presenting digital conversion services available as alternative to offshore services for sensitive and non-sensitive information conversion.

Government Printing Office (GPO) - **Ms. Janice Sterling** is the Director of Creative Services at GPO and **Ms. Kimberly Ross** is a Production Manager for Creative Services.

Ms. Sterling and Ms. Ross will explore information delivery services including digital products in support of ePublications and web site content.

Library of Congress (LOC) - **Mr. Bill LeFurgy** is the Digital Initiatives Project Manager at the Library of Congress. He manages projects for the National Digital Information Infrastructure and Preservation Program (NDIIPP), which includes work with over 30 state archives and 100 other institutions.

Mr. LeFurgy will present LOC's information management services that focus on long-term preservation of eRecords and digital information content.
