**Abstract:** The Department of the Interior is addressing M-12-18 on an enterprise scale. Using enterprise-wide, functional retention schedules based on lines of business, the Department uses auto-classification to manage email into its Super Buckets. The overall solution supports records, e-discovery, FOIA, Ethics, Administrative / Congressional records, cybercrime investigations, and inspector general activities. This presentation provides strategies used to establish the program, garnering support, consolidating systems, and applying auto-classification to manage content at receipt or transmission. Based on real world experience, this may assist others in formulating strategies and realizing the possibilities of an enterprise-wide solution, which addresses M-12-18.
